John S. Rumsfeld, M.D., Ph.D., FACC, FAHA received his medical degree from the University of Chicago (1991) and doctoral degree in epidemiology from the University of Colorado (1999). He completed his internal medicine internship and residency at the University of California, San Francisco (1991–94), and cardiology fellowship at the University of Colorado (1995–99). Dr. Rumsfeld is a staff cardiologist and cardiovascular outcomes researcher at the Denver VA Medical Center, and is associate professor of medicine at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center.

Dr. Rumsfeld serves on the Steering Committee of the American Heart Association's Quality of Care and Outcomes Research (QCOR) Interdisciplinary Working Group, and is vice-chair of the American College of Cardiology/American Heart Association Task Force on Performance Measures. Dr. Rumsfeld is also chief science officer for the National Cardiovascular Data Registry (NCDR). Within the Veterans Health Administration, Dr. Rumsfeld is the national clinical coordinator for the Ischemic Heart Disease Quality Enhancement Research Initiative and Clinical Director for the VA Cardiac Assessment, Reporting and Tracking system for Cath Labs (CART-CL).

2. Click on the Signup link you'll see at the upper right corner of any page.
3. Complete the form you'll see on the "Signup" page with the required information — your name, email address, password, and time zone.
4. Submit the form, and our system will tell you to check your email.
5. Wait a bit and then open your email inbox, find our message, and then click on the link in the message.
