Description of Award

Applicants for study/research awards design their own projects and will typically work with advisers at foreign universities or other institutes of higher education. The study/research awards are available in approximately 140 countries.

Eligibility

- US citizen or permanent resident
- Conferred bachelor's degree or equivalent
- Meet language requirements
- Preferred qualifications
 - Never received Fulbright in past
 - Higher education was undertaken primarily in the United States
 - Have not resided in or studied in the country they are applying to for more than 6 months (not counting undergrad study abroad or duty abroad as part of the Armed Forces)
 - Served in the Armed Forces (provided qualifications are equivalent to other candidates)

Statement of Grant Purpose (2 pages)

- Field of study
- Project title
- Abstract/summary of proposal
- Project timeline
- Host country engagement
- Plans upon return to the US

Personal Statement (1 page)
